ACADEMIC PARTNERSHIP WITH UNIVERSITY OF GREENWICH

We are pleased to announce that our courses are accredited by the University of Greenwich. Students will complete 180 credits at BCNH and 180 credits at Greenwich University. Graduates will be awarded a **BSc (Hons) Complementary Therapies (Nutritional Health)**.

Students registering with BCNH will also be registered as a student of the Greenwich university. This means that students not only receive the full academic support of BCNH, but also have full access to the University's learning resources.

- Candidates who do not comply with the above requirements, are required to complete the BCNH Science Foundation Course (SFC) and pass all the SFC exams.

STUDY TIME

Diploma and Degree Modules - PART TIME

- **Approximately 65 - 75 hours per module** - approx. 12 hours per week (depending on the individual). This includes time spent writing course assignments.

Diploma and Degree Modules - FULL TIME

- VERY LITTLE HOME STUDY IS REQUIRED AS MOST OF THE STUDY IS DONE AT THE COLLEGE. However, students will complete some course assignments at home.

Modules are taught from mid September to mid April.

Between mid April and the end of June, students will be preparing for their examinations.

(SFC) - SCIENCE FOUNDATION COURSES

BCNH Science Foundation Course (SFC) is designed for the following candidates:

- Those who wish to study nutritional therapy courses and do not have 'A' Level Biology and/or Chemistry.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q: Is the course length sufficient to prepare me for Diploma or Degree studies?

A: The SFC (10 months in length) will give students sufficient scientific knowledge, which will enable students to follow the topics on the Diploma or Degree course.

Q: Can I do the course by correspondence?

A: You can. You can enrol on the SFC correspondence course at any time during the year.

Q: Does BCNH recognise Science Foundation Courses from other institutions?

A: BCNH does recognise other courses (eg. Birkbeck College), subject to approval by the Principal.

Q: Can I study only the Biology or the Chemistry module?

A: You can, provided that you have the relevant A-level in the module from which you wish to be exempt.

Q: Are Distance Learning modules cheaper than attendance modules?

A: Both courses have the same fee.

BCNH DISTANCE LEARNING, ATTENDANCE & COMBINATION COURSES

DISTANCE LEARNING COURSES

Distance Learning Courses are suitable for individuals who cannot physically attend lectures and seminars in London.

- Students receive audio CDs for each lecture and seminar. Module notes are available from BCNH website.
- Students have a personal tutor who will support them throughout their study at BCNH.
- Students can sit examination in their own home town, providing they arrange a suitable Invigilator who will be approved by the college. Students pay the exam invigilation fee.

CLINICAL ATTENDANCE

- A compulsory in-class clinical attendance is required in Years 2, 3 and 4 of the course. Clinical sessions are arranged in clusters to minimise students' frequency of travel to London.

ATTENDANCE COURSES

Attendance Courses are suitable for individuals who live in or near London and can physically attend lectures and seminars at the University College London, where BCNH hires lecture rooms.

- Students attend ONE weekend a month (Saturday and Sunday 10am - 5pm) and two evenings a month (6pm - 9pm) between September and April. Between April and June, students prepare for the end of the year examination.
- Students have a personal tutor who will support them throughout their study at BCNH.
- Students who miss a lecture or a seminar can buy audio CDs to catch up.

COMBINATION COURSES

Combination Courses are suitable for individuals who, due to distance or family commitments, are not able to physically attend all lectures and seminars.

- Students attend weekends and /or evening seminars as agreed by the college at the beginning of the academic year. Eg some student attends lecture weekends and complete evening seminars by correspondence.
- Students have a personal tutor who support them throughout their study at BCNH.

CLINICAL ATTENDANCE

- Students, who do not attend clinical seminars must attend a compulsory clinical training in Years 2, 3 and 4 of the course. Clinical sessions are arranged in clusters to minimise students' frequency of travel to London.
